## Introduction

The Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU), the world's largest University was established by an Act of Parliament in 1985, has continuously striven to build a knowledge society through inclusive education. It has tried to make a mark in the higher education of the country by offering high quality teaching through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) mode. As enshrined, in its mandate IGNOU reaches out to the unreached, disadvantaged and marginalized sections of our society and has continuously tried to increase the Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER). IGNOU has currently more than 232 academic programmes (Ph.D/M.Phil, Master/Bachelor, PG Diploma/Diploma & Certificate) on offer through 67 Regional Centres (RCs) spread across the country and ably supported by more than 3000 Learner Support Centres (LSCs) and 29 overseas partner institutions. It serves to the educational aspiration of over 3 million learners in India and other countries through its 21 School of Studies with a strength of 810 faculty members and 574 academic staff at HQs & Regional Centres and about 43,785 Academic Counsellors at its LSCs from conventional institutions of higher learning, professional organisations and industries among others. Through its substantial LSC network, the University seeks to redeem its promise of providing higher education to all the segments. The main features of the University are as under:

## Brief History of Regional Centre Chandigarh

In open and distance teaching learning process the role of Regional Centre occupies pivotal position in monitoring, coordination and delivery of programmes. The IGNOU Act defines the "Regional Centre" as a centre established or maintained by the University for the purpose of coordinating and supervising the work of Study Centres in the region and for performing such functions as may be confirmed by the Board of Management of the University. Regional Centre is

considered as face of the University for all its practical purposes. Under the diversified delivery system, the University has also introduced the concept of programme specific Study Centres for professional courses and Special Study Centres for remote and rural areas, women, minorities, jail inmates etc. Regional Centre maintains effective link between the different Schools and Divisions of the University and Learners Support Centres, between IGNOU and respective State Governments and between IGNOU and the general stakeholders.

Therefore, in order to strengthen its student support services in and around tri-city of Chandigarh, Mohali and Panchkula and adjoining districts of Punjab and Haryana, Indira Gandhi National Open University, established Regional Centre at Chandigarh on 1st January, 2009 by carving out a few Learners Support Centres of Chandigarh and it adjoining districts of Punjab & Haryana. Although the number of LSCs attached were very few, but considering the interest of the Learners in IGNOU programmes more Learners Support Centres were established over a period of time. The Jurisdiction of Regional Centre was bifurcated from Regional Centre Khanna and Karnal which are catering the Open and Distance Learning needs of the states of Punjab and Haryana respectively. It is one of the fast upcoming Regional Centre in the country in terms of student enrolment, number of Learner Support Centres, programmes activated and various decentralized operational functions. Since then with the consistent efforts, the enrolment of various programmes is increasing steadily and in 2018 it has crossed thirteen thousand. Regional Centre is making all efforts to provide best support services to its learners with a network of 26 LSC's in the region. As a result in every Convocation some students of this RC receive University gold medal for best performance in the respective programme.

## Demographic Profile of the Region

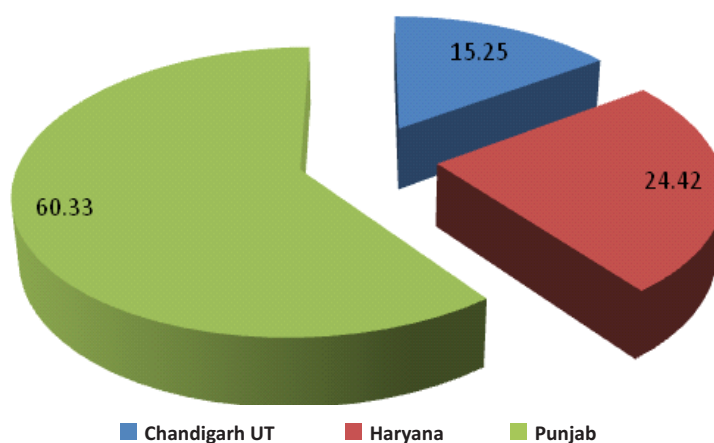
Total population covered under Chandigarh Regional Centre is 69.20 lakhs as per census 2011, out of which 10.55 lakhs represent Chandigarh UT which constitute to 15.25 percent population of the region. The population of Haryana state served by this RC is 16.89 lakhs which is 24.42 percent of the total population of the region. On the other hand 41.75 lakhs people of the state of Punjab are also served by RC Chandigarh which constitute to 60.23 percent population of this RC. Therefore, 6.66 and 15.07 percent population of the states of Punjab and Haryana is served by this RC respectively. Out of the total population 26.19 percent are from Scheduled Caste which is 18.86 percent, 20.16 percent and 31.98 percent from Chandigarh (UT) Haryana and Punjab respectively.

**Area-wise Percent Population Served**



This region has wide variation in the density of population as the total area of Chandigarh (UT) is 114 sq.km. which accommodates 9258 people per sq.km. which is significantly higher compared with the other districts of the region. The density of population is highest in Mohali (909 people per sq.km.) followed by Ambala (717 per sq.km.). The lowest density of population among the districts is reported in Rupnagar which accommodates 509 people per sq.km. as per census 2011. On the other hand the area is highest in Patiala which was reported 3325 sq.km. The area of Panchkula district is 898 sq.km which lowest among all the districts of the region. RC Chandigarh covers 49.22 percent population

from the rural and 51.78 percent population from the urban areas. The rural population is lowest in Chandigarh (2.75 percent) followed by Panchkula (44.19 percent). Rupnagar is predominantly a rural district as 74.03 percent people resides in the rural area. The literacy rate of the majority of the districts is relatively higher and it was 86.05 percent in Chandigarh. In majority of the districts more than 80 percent people are literate except Patiala where it was reported 75.28 percent. The literacy rate of UT Chandigarh was 86.05 percent and among the other districts it was highest 83.80 percent in Patiala and 79.35 percent in Fatehgarh Sahib.

Interesting picture has emerged in the Table-3 as 74.85 percent enrolment share is from Chandigarh UT followed by 12.13 percent from Panchkula and 0.55 percent from Mohali. Therefore, the enrolment share of tri-city is 87.53 percent. The enrolment share of Patiala is 6.78 percent and Ambala is 5.60 percent. Regional Centre is yet to make progress in Mohali, Fatehgarh Sahib and Rupnagar districts. Average number of LSCs per sq.km. is only 0.023 and the

same is much lower in the districts other than UT. Similarly on an average 0.12 students are enrolled per thousand population in the region which is marginally higher in Chandigarh where it was 0.62 students per sq.km. These indicators clearly states that significant progress is required to be made to make Open and Distance Learning accessibly to all segments of the society. However, RC Chandigarh is making all efforts to reaching the unreached.

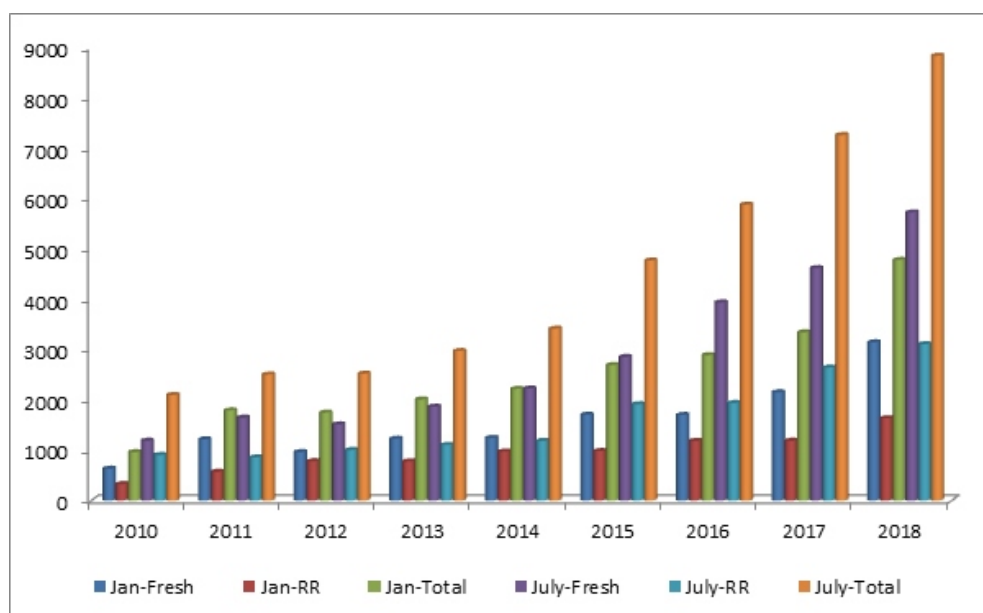

### Student Enrolment Trend

Student enrolment of the Regional Centre has been increasing constantly, except in 2012 where there was marginal decrease (-0.65 percent) in enrolment and this was due to closure of programmes offered under special education. On the other hand the highest increase in student enrolment was in 2011 where an increase of 40.40 percent was registered which was followed by 23.45 percent in 2015. The increasing trend was noticed in both the sessions and both in

fresh and re-registration. In order to increase the enrolment the academics of the RC with the help of LSC functionaries organises admission camps in the rural areas, institute of conventional education and other potential catchment areas such as in the areas of armed forces and paramilitary forces and Central and District jails for jail inmates. In 2010 total enrolment of the Regional Centre was 3062 and same has increased to 8770 in 2016 and in 2018 it has crossed 13 thousand and registering a growth of 28.42 percentage over previous year.

Level-wise enrolment shows that majority of the students were enrolled in the Bachelor Degree programmes (44.16 percent) followed by Master Degree (25.27 percent). Only 4.90 percent students were enrolled in the PG Diplomas and 7.90 percent in Certificate programmes. Therefore, 69.43 percent learners in the region were enrolled in Bachelor and Master Degree programmes. The table-5 clearly indicates that similar trend persisted over the years.

### Profile of Learners

IGNOU programmes in this region are popular across the different sections of the society including male-female, rural-urban and Scheduled Caste, Schedule Tribe, Other Backward Class and General Category of learners. Youth as well as serving and retired persons take admission in the programmes offered by the University and the programmes are also popular among the housewives. It may be noted that:

37 percent learners who took admission in the various programmes of the University were female and 63 percent were male.

Among the different social groups 70 percent were from General Category, 18 percent SC/ST and 11 percent represents the OBCs.

The learners reported as employed were 76 percent and remaining 24 percent were unemployed.

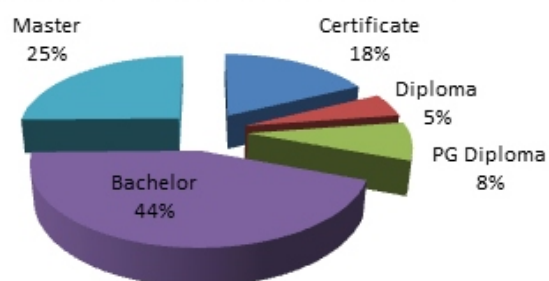

### Fee Collected and Expenditure Incurred

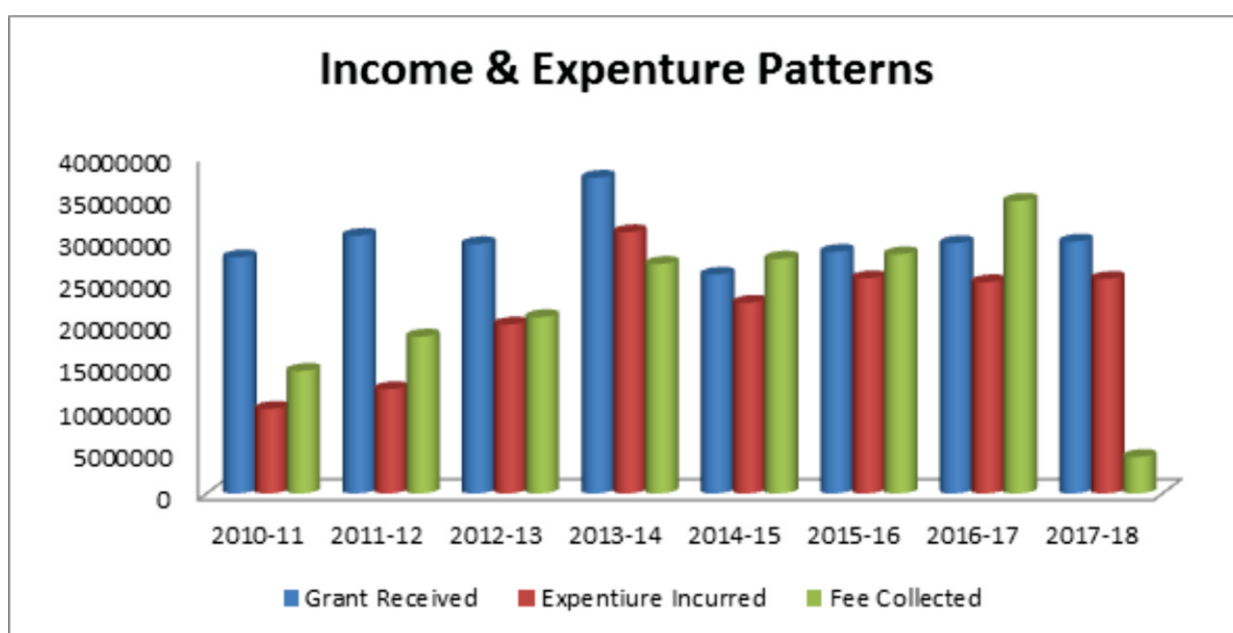
Total collection of fees by RC was 1.45 crore in 2010-11 and the same has been increased to 3.46 crore in 2016-17, registering a growth of 138.77 percent over a period of seven years. Considering the coverage area of the region the growth in revenue generation is significant but a lot more efforts are required to increase the enrolment thereby increasing the revenue generation. As far as fee collection is considered increasing trend has persisted over

the years. On the other hand on an average 88-90 percent of the grant was utilised by the RC over the years. Highest utilisation under non plan grant was in 2012-13 (92.83 percent). The expenditure was consistent over the years however in the initial years it was relatively low mainly due to concentration of expenditure on administrative activities only. The expenditure of the RC was less than fee generated in most of the years except in 2013-14.

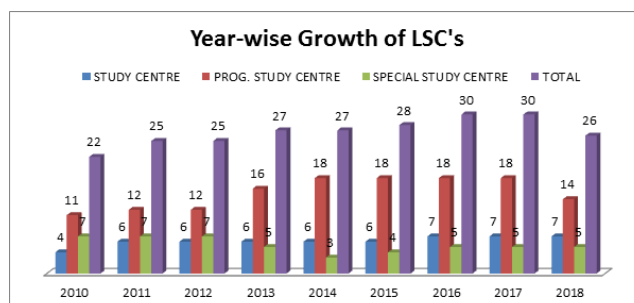

## Growth of Learners Support Centres

There were 25 Learner Support Centres in 2012 which included 6 Study Centres, 12 Programme Study Centres and 7 Special Study Centres and the number of Learner Support Centres has increased to 31 in 2017 including 7 Study Centres, 19 Programme Study Centres and 5 Special Study Centres. Although there was an increase in Learner Support Centres over the years, however, in 2013 three Special Study Centres were closed due to closure of programmes offered under special education by National Centre for Disability Studies (NCDS). All the districts under this RC except Rupnagar are covered with Learner Support

Centres. However, maximum Learner Support Centres are located in Chandigarh UT. The number of active LSCs in 2018 was 26. List of Learner Support Centres with programmes activated is placed in Annexure-A.



## Activities at Learner Support Centre

### Pre-admission Counselling and Guidance

Pre-admission counselling is organised by each Learner Support Centre to facilitate the learners in selection of programmes and courses. The learners are also sensitized to the importance of self-learning and how it could be facilitated, and how counselling sessions are different from class-room teaching-learning sessions. They are also informed of the role of the assignments in general and Tutor-Marked-Assignments in particular in ODL mode of learning. Academics from Regional Centre also visit Learners Support Centres and its catchment area for pre-admission camps and guidance is rendered to the prospective learners. These camps are generally organised in the conventional colleges/institute of higher learning, catchment villages, offices of government and semi-government organisations and camp offices of armed forces and paramilitary forces.

### Publicity and promotional activities

In order to popularise IGNOU programmes in the catchment areas of the LSCs, time to time press release is issued in local daily newspapers, visit is made to nearby locality by organising awareness camps, leaflets and pamphlets are also distributed. These leaflets are also distributed in religious and social gathering. The leaflet specially designed for the distribution contains vital information on the programmes activated in the nearest LSC. These activities are under taken by all the LSCs under the guidance of RC.

### Induction Meeting

At the commencement of each academic session, each Study Centre meticulously organizes an Induction Meeting for the new learners. The Induction Meeting is a hallmark of an academic session. It usually lasts for about 3 hours. During the Induction Meeting, the learners are introduced to the system of Open & Distance Learning and also to the role of HQs., Regional Centre, and that of Study Centre, where special reference is made about counseling sessions and submission of assignments. The learners are sensitized to the importance of self-learning and how it could be

facilitated, and how counseling sessions are different from class-room teaching-learning sessions. They are also informed of the role of the assignments in general and Tutor-Marked-Assignments in particular.

During the Induction Meeting important dates for submission of assignments, examination forms, re-registration, etc., are informed to the learners. Learners are also introduced to the functionaries of the Centre and the counsellors. The formal session ends with informal interaction over a cup of tea with functionaries and counsellors of IGNOU.

### Face to face Counselling

The Study Centre organizes counselling sessions that are governed by the blend of traditional and modern flair. However, in the case of IT and ICT based courses in various programmes pertaining to Computer Science, Library Science and Management, at times the computer labs are virtually turned into class-rooms to facilitate the learning process at the Study Centre. Counselling are organised on Sunday and holiday and counselling schedule is uploaded on the website of Regional Centre and Study Centre. Learners are encouraged to attend the counselling session as these sessions are beneficial to enhance their performance in the Term End Examination (TEE).

### Term End Examination and Practical Examination

Term end examination and practical examination are conducted as per schedule. Students are expected to fill online examination forms and submit the requisite assignments before appearing in TEE. It is clear that there has been an increase in the number of students appearing in the TEE. In June, 2013 TEE 2952 learners appeared from this region and the same has been 4665 in June 2017 examination. Examinations are conducted at the study Centres and in June 2017 TEE five Kendriya Vidyalaya(s) were also made examination centres.

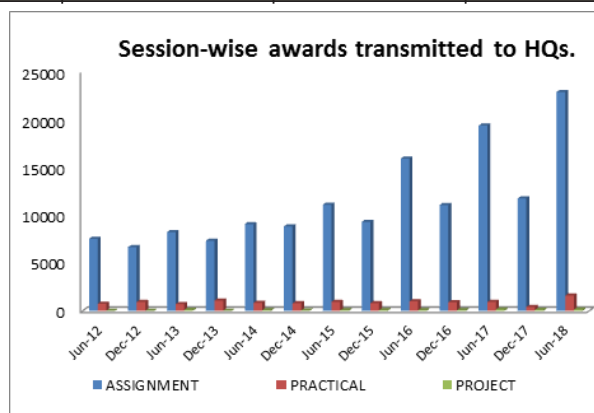

### Assignments, Projects and Practical

Learners are given assignments along with study material which they submit at the Study Centres and efforts are made that the assignments are timely evaluated and student's grades/marks are uploaded on University website as per schedule. Since assignment is very important tool of teaching the academic counsellors are thoroughly oriented before evaluation of assignment. For this purpose orientation programmes are organised at the LSC level where academics of RC and experience academic counsellors are involved to orient the ACs. Number of assignments evaluated and data transmitted to the HQs. is presented in Table - 8. There has been continuous increase in the number of assignment evaluated and data transmitted to the HQs. Data pertaining to the practical examination and project are also sent to HQs. in time.

For this purpose RC is always in constant touch with its warehouse and MPDD. In emergent cases other RCs are also approached for SLM in order to facilitate the learners.

## Convocation

Each year, RC organises Convocation as per the schedule provided by the headquarters. The convocation is simultaneously organised at all RCs and HQs. In the convocation RC also organises exhibition of RC activities during the years. This is a unique function organised by the University every year and the Table-9 clearly indicates that there has been increase in the degree recipients over the year. The students of the RC also received University Gold medals in the respective Convocation for their best performance.

## Regional Centre's Initiatives

### Students Help Desk

In order to provide student support services to the learners RC Chandigarh has created a Student support counter (Student Help Desk) for the learners. At this counters the learners are facilitated for the following activities:

- Provided pre-admission counselling in selection of programmes and courses by the academics of the RC.
- A facility for submitting online admission forms and guiding the learners in filling the online admission forms and examination forms.
- POS has been installed at the counter to facilitate the learners to submit their dues pertaining to admission, re-registration, examination and others charges such as course change, duplicate ID card, issue of Degree, migration certificate etc.
- Facilities are also provided to the persons with disabilities by reaching them and rendering support services. RC also conduct TEE of such students as per norms of GOI.



### Village Adoption Scheme under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan

Regional Centre Chandigarh has adopted the area of Morni Hills in Panchkula district under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan. A special Study Centre 06023D has been established in the area under this Abhiyan. Besides enrolling the learners in different programmes of the University, other activities such as Cleanliness drives, blood donation camp, plantation camp, awareness campaign etc. are also regularly being organised by the SSC from time to time.

### Digital Awareness Campaign

Under 'Digital India' initiatives SSC staff visited the prospective learners at their door steps and helped them in filling their online admission, RR and TEE forms under reach the unreached motto of IGNOU. Awareness campaign for digital literacy mission under VISAKA 'Aao ham digital ho jaaye' was conducted in Panchkula District by organising a training session at SSC-06023D, Morni Community College, Morni.

### Special Study Centres in Jails

### SSC Activities under Swachh Bharat Mission

● इग्नू इस समय पंचकूला रीजन में कितने कोर्स करवा रहा है?

-पंचकूला रीजन में 112 तरह के कोर्स करवाए जा रहे हैं। हमारे रीजन में चंडीगढ़ एरिया के सबसे ज्यादा छात्र हैं। इसके अलावा हरियाणा एवं पंजाब के कुछ जिलों से भी छात्र कोर्स कर रहे हैं। इस साल 10526 छात्रों ने विभिन्न कोर्सों के लिए दाखिला लिया है। इस बार पिछले साल के मुकाबले 24 प्रतिशत छात्रों की वृद्धि हुई है। 31 परीक्षा सेंटर बनाए हैं।

● किस तरह के छात्र इग्नू रीजनल सेंटर में दाखिला लेते हैं?

-हमारे पास ज्यादातर छात्र ऐसे हैं जिनके घर की आर्थिक स्थिति ठीक नहीं है या वह सामाजिक या पारिवारिक कारणों से अपनी उच्चतर पढ़ाई नहीं कर पाए। उनमें जन्मा धा, लेकिन समय के अभाव ने उन्हें कुछ करने का मौका नहीं दिया, लेकिन वह फिर से अपनी पढ़ाई को आगे बढ़ा रहे हैं।

● क्या छात्रों को रेगुलर

क्लासेज लगानी पड़ती हैं?

जी नहीं। हमारे यहां किसी तरह की कोई बंदिश नहीं है। यहां पर न तो क्लास लगानी की बंदिश है और न ही उम्र की कोई बंदिश है। छात्रों के लिए पूरी तरह फ्लेक्सिबिलिटी दी जाती है।

● छात्रों को कोर्स तय समय में पूरा करना होता है?

-जी नहीं। 30 से 35 प्रतिशत छात्र हर साल ऐसे होते हैं जोकि तय समय में कोर्स पूरा नहीं पाते। हमारे यहां छात्रों को फेल नहीं किया जाता। जिस छात्र ने एक बार बार पेपर दिए और दो में हो पास हुआ, तो अगली बार उसे दो ही पेपर देने हैं जिसे पास उतीर्ण नहीं कर पाते। कई बार तो छात्र तीन साल का कोर्स 6 साल में पूरा करते हैं।

● छात्रों के लिए काउंसलिंग की सुविधा है?

जिन छात्रों को पढ़ाई करने में दिक्कत आती है और वह किसी विषय पर जानकारी चाहते हैं तो उन्हें स्पेशल काउंसलिंग भी दी जाती है। फेस टू फेस काउंसलिंग होती है। इंटरव्यूशन मीटिंग एवं प्रमोशनल प्रोग्राम करवाए जाते हैं।

● इग्नू में दाखिले के लिए क्या ऑनलाइन सिस्टम है?

जी बिल्कुल, इग्नू अब पूरी तरह ऑनलाइन हो गया है। दाखिला से लेकर पढ़ाई तक सब कुछ ऑनलाइन होता है। आइटीसी इन्फर्मेशन, कम्युनिकेशन और टेक्नोलॉजी पर विशेष फोकस है।

● इग्नू पीएचडी कोर्स भी करवा रहा है?

-जी हां, इसी वर्ष से पीएचडी के सभी तरह के कोर्स शुरू हो चुके हैं। पंचकूला रीजन में फिलाहाल यह सुविधा नहीं है लेकिन दिल्ली से पीएचडी को लेकर सभी कर्करवाई की जाती है। इस बार 600 स्टूडेंट्स ने विभिन्न विषयों में पीएचडी के लिए एंट्रेंस दिया है।

● एलएलबी को लेकर छात्रों के लिए कोई योजना है?

-इग्नू की बड़ी इच्छा है कि एलएलबी के कोर्स शुरू किए जाएं लेकिन बार कौंसिल ऑफ इंडिया से इसकी परमिशन लेनी पड़ती है। कई बार कौंसिल से इस बारे में चर्चा हुई, लेकिन सिले नहीं चढ़ पाई।
